89 **TO THE HONORABLE COURT, RESPONDENTS, AND ALL INTERESTED PARTIES:**10 Petitioner Joel Gilbert hereby applies ex parte for issuance of an Alternative Writ of Mandate and
11 for an Order Shortening Time pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure sections 1085, 1087, and
12 California Rules of Court, rule 3.1200 et seq.13
14 **I. RELIEF REQUESTED**

15 Petitioner respectfully requests that the Court:

16 1. Issue an Alternative Writ of Mandate directing Respondent Secretary of State either to refrain
17 from certifying Eric Michael Swalwell as a candidate for Governor of California for the 2026
18 election or to appear and show cause why such relief should not be granted;
19 2. Order expedited briefing and shorten time for hearing in light of impending election deadlines.20
21 **II. GROUNDS FOR EX PARTE RELIEF**22 Ex parte relief is warranted because election-related writ proceedings are inherently time-sensitive.
23 If Respondent is permitted to certify an ineligible candidate or proceed toward ballot preparation,
24 Petitioner and California voters will suffer irreparable harm that cannot be remedied after the fact.
25 Once ballot preparation or certification deadlines pass, no post-hoc judicial remedy can restore a
26 lawful ballot, rendering ordinary noticed motion practice inadequate.

1 | III. FACTUAL BASIS

2 As detailed in the accompanying Petition for Writ of Mandate and supporting exhibits, Eric Michael
3 Swalwell has declared a Washington, D.C. property as his principal residence, has no verifiable
4 California domicile, and filed a Candidate Intention Statement under penalty of perjury listing a law
5 firm address as his residence. These undisputed, objective documentary facts establish
6 constitutional ineligibility.

8 | IV. LEGAL AUTHORITY

9 Code of Civil Procedure section 1087 expressly authorizes issuance of an alternative writ. Courts
10 routinely grant expedited writ relief in election matters where statutory or constitutional eligibility is
11 at issue, particularly where the Secretary of State's duties are ministerial and time-sensitive in order
12 to preserve ballot integrity and prevent unlawful certification of candidates.

14 | V. NOTICE

15 Petitioner has provided notice of this ex parte application to the Office of the California Secretary of
16 State and the Office of the California Attorney General in compliance with California Rules of
17 Court, rule 3.1203.

19 | VI. CONCLUSION

20 For the foregoing reasons, Petitioner respectfully requests that the Court grant this ex parte
21 application.

21 | I, Joel Gilbert, declare:

23 1. I am the Petitioner in this action and am self-represented. I have personal knowledge of the facts
24 stated herein and could competently testify to them if called as a witness.

26 2. This declaration is submitted in support of my Ex Parte Application for issuance of an Alternative
27 Writ of Mandate and an Order Shortening Time.

1 3. This is an election-law writ proceeding challenging the certification of a candidate for Governor
2 of California. Election matters are inherently time-sensitive and require prompt judicial review.

4 4. Immediate relief is required because if Respondent proceeds toward certification or ballot
5 preparation for the 2026 gubernatorial election, Petitioner and California voters will suffer
6 irreparable harm that cannot be remedied after ballots are printed or votes are cast.
